DON'T MISS MACRA AND THE FUTURE OF THE ACA ON FEBRUARY 2ND!

New Year's Greetings to all. I hope that you all had an enjoyable holiday season embracing traditions and customs with your families and loved ones. It is a new year and I would like to extend to all my best wishes for a prosperous and successful new year.


The new year will bring monumental changes that will significantly impact health care in this country at all levels affecting both providers and patients. The new administration in Washington promises changes to the Affordable Healthcare Act. That in itself is an

unpredictable transition to be followed closely.

More clearly defined is the Medicare Access & CHIP Reauthorization Act (MACRA) of 2015. Initial implementation occurred in 2016 with full implementation to occur over the next two years, 2017 - 2018. Under the MACRA the next few years will see significant changes with the transition from fee-for-service to new value-based payment models. In January 2015, the Department of Health and Human Services announced new goals for value-based payments and alternative payment models (APMs). The first goal ties Medicare payments to quality or value through alternative payment models (categories 3-4) by the end of 2016 and 50% by the end of 2018. The second goal ties Medicare fee-for-service to quality or value (categories 2-4) by the end of 2016, and 90% by the end of 2018.

MACRA is a major policy shift toward transforming the US health care system. These changes are designed to provide "Better care", "Smarter spending," and "Healthier people."

How does MACRA achieve these lofty goals? Title I of MACRA:

- Repeals the Sustainable Growth Rate (SGR) formula
- Changes the way that Medicare rewards clinicians for value over
- Streamlines multiple quality programs under the new Merit-Based Incentive Payments System (MIPS)
- Provides bonus payments for participation in eligible alternative models (APMs)

There is a considerable amount to digest and understand with MACRA implementation. Adapting to these

new payment models will require changes in how physicians work. The changes will impact physicians in independent small and medium-sized practices differently than employed physicians in larger systems.

The Genesee County Medical Society will address MACRA and its impact on physicians in its next Town Hall Meeting on Feb. 2, 2016. The meeting title is MACRA: How Independent physicians and others can thrive in a value-based environment. The featured presenters will be former AMA President J. James Rohack, MD along with Stacey Hettiger, Director, Medical and Regulatory Policy, at the Michigan State Medical Society. They will provide help and support for physicians moving toward these new payment models.

The meeting will be held at the Flint Golf Club. Physicians, Spouses, and Practice managers are all invited and welcome to attend this timely and informative Town Hall Meeting. I look forward to seeing many of you in attendance.





DEA REVERSES ANNOUNCED CHANGE TO REGISTRATION RENEWAL PROCESS

The AMA recently alerted the Federation to a notice from the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) that effective Jan. 1, 2017, the DEA was changing its longstanding policy of allowing a grace period for registrants who failed to file a timely renewal application. Late yesterday afternoon, the DEA reversed its decision and posted a notice that it is retaining its current policy and procedures, with one minor change, regarding registration renewals. The revised announcement states the following:

REVISED ANNOUNCEMENT REGARDING RENEWAL APPLICATIONS

Starting January 2017, DEA will no longer send its second renewal notification by mail. Instead, an electronic reminder to renew will be sent to the email address associated with the DEA registration.

At this time, DEA will otherwise retain its current policy and procedures with respect to renewal and reinstatement of registration. This policy is as follows:


- If a renewal application is submitted in a timely manner prior to expiration, the registrant may continue operations, authorized by the registration, beyond the expiration date until final action is taken on the application.
- DEA allows the reinstatement of an expired registration for one calendar month after the expiration date. If the registration is not renewed within that calendar month, an application for a new DEA registration will be required.
- Regardless of whether a registration is reinstated within the calendar month after expiration, federal law prohibits the handling of controlled substances or List 1 chemicals for any period of time under an expired registration.

So, The AMA reports that the good news is that registration numbers will not automatically be retired if renewal applications are filed within the one-month grace period after the expiration date. However, there are a few issues that need clarification from the DEA, including whether the filing of a renewal application during

the one-month grace period automatically reinstates the registration number or whether DEA must adjudicate the renewal application before the number becomes valid. It also is not clear whether a registration number remains valid if the registrant files a renewal application during the grace period and DEA fails to adjudicate the application before the end of the month. The AMA will be following up with DEA staff on these issues and will update the Federation accordingly.

DECEMBER LEGISLATIVE LIAISON COMMITTEE MEETING

On Dec. 5th, the Legislative Liaison Committee meeting was held. Attendees included Gary Jones from Congressman Kildee's office, Representative Joe Graves, Bryanna McGarry from Senator Ananich's office, and Nicole Derusha-Mackey from Representative Faris' office. In addition, Phil Phelps, State Representative, and Colin Ford of the Michigan State Medical Society attended.

The Committee heard a presentation on the Senate Bill 1019 which would expand scope of practice for certified registered nurse anesthetists. It has passed out of the Senate and is now in the House Health Policy Committee. The legislation was timed it to possibly come out the day after the meeting. Our Representatives Phelps and Graves serve on House Health Policy Committee and will both be No votes on this legislation.

House bill 5400, advanced practice registered nurses, will likely pass. MSMS was neutral, but the content of the bill is satisfactory with MSMS.

A medical malpractice Senate bill 1104 has been set up to correct a procedural decision by the courts, and is expected to pass.

Regarding the Michigan Automated Prescription System update, legislation has been passed, and funds allocated to perform a thorough renovation and update of MAPS.

The next meeting of the GCMS Legislative Liaison Committee will take place on February 6, 2017.

WHY WE SUPPORT DR. PRICE TO LEAD HHS

The AMA supports the nomination of Dr. Tom Price based on decades of interactions with him as a member of the AMA House of Delegates, Georgia state senator and as a member of the House of Representatives since 2005. Over these years, there have been important policy issues on which we agreed (medical liability reform) and others on which we disagreed (passage of the Affordable Care Act). Two things that have been consistent are his understanding of the many challenges facing patients and physicians today, and his willingness to listen directly to concerns expressed by the AMA and other physician organizations.

An orthopaedic surgeon for nearly twenty years, Dr. Price would be the first physician to serve as secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services since President George H.W. Bush appointed Louis W. Sullivan, MD, in 1989, and only the third doctor to serve as secretary of the department in its 63-year

history. That physician background will provide important perspective within the president's cabinet. Too often, health policy makers and regulators give short shrift to the real-world impact their plans and decisions can have on how patient care is delivered.

RELATED COVERAGE Trump's HHS pick brings physician, policy experience to role

Even prior to his 2004 election to Congress, Dr. Price brought his physician experience to bear on health policy as a member of the Georgia Senate, where he served on the Health and Human Services Committee and supported efforts to improve child

safety and expand patient choice. The AMA recognized his state legislative work with the Dr. Nathan Davis Award. More recently, Dr. Price has taken part as a speaker in AMA-organized policy events, such as a 2015 tele-town hall that prompted conversation on how to chart a better course on electronic health records.



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A mainstay through the years has been Dr. Price's commitment to seek out and hear the concerns expressed by the AMA and other physician organizations. Even so, our support for Dr. Price to

lead HHS should not be taken as an endorsement of every policy position he has advocated.

The conversation surrounding President-elect Trump's HHS choice caused me to reflect on a similar episode in the history of U.S. health care. When Ronald Reagan named pediatric surgeon C. Everett Koop, MD, as surgeon general, the move prompted a flurry of opposition based on Dr. Koop's fervent opposition to abortion.

Despite that early resistance, Dr. Koop went on to become a powerful and constructive voice during the AIDS epidemic, helping to advance education, prevention and treatment responses that reduced stigma, deaths and suffering. He also released eight reports on tobacco use's baleful health consequences and promoted the goal of a smoke-free society. Dr. Koop's one-time opponents later cited him as a role model for how the U.S. surgeon general can help the nation face serious health care challenges.

The AMA will actively engage Dr. Price, other leaders in the incoming Trump administration and Congress in discussions on the health system's future direction. We remain devoted to improving health insurance coverage so that patients receive timely, highquality care, preventive services and other necessary medical treatments. And for us, a core principle with regard to any proposed health system reform is that it should not cause anyone who has health insurance coverage now to lose it.

We look forward to a continuing conversation with Dr. Price as we work together on the health care priorities where we share common ground.



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



