For physicians and health care workers, sadness may feel like a shadow. A shadow that might pass quickly or might linger for a while. Realize that during COVID-19, sadness might linger longer.
6. Sadness is a valid and useful emotion. It is important to recognize it, acknowledge it, and talk about it.
7. When times are tough, dare to be tougher. The strongest people are not those who show strength in front of others, but those who win battles others know nothing about.
8. We must be protective of our physical and mental health, including getting enough sleep, exercise, nutrition, and managing stress and events of life the best we can.
9. Emotional health is real. Mental health is real. Taking care of yourself is important. If you do not, nobody else will.
10. Our health is our true wealth. Most people learn to appreciate it only when they lose it. During this pandemic, many did.

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### GCMS Members Making an Impact in the Community

The world has been challenged with staying healthy and safe since the COVID 19 pandemic started more than a year ago. Sacrifices have to be made (wearing masks, distancing, etc.) to keep from spreading a highly contagious virus.

The third wave of the COVID 19 pandemic has proved most challenging. Variant strains of the virus have emerged more contagious than the original virus. Large gatherings without masks and social distancing have been a significant source of spreading of the virus.

The Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are 94%-95% effective in preventing severe COVID 19 symptoms. Scheduling the vaccination the first 3 months of 2021 has proven difficult due to vaccine supply shortages in Genesee County. The Genesee County Health Department (GCHD) is challenged with the unprecedented task of vaccinating all residents that agree to be inoculated.

Dr. Brenda Rogers-Grays (GCMS member) working with the GCHD organized a COVID 19 vaccination site at her church. On April 2, 2021 Dr Rogers-Grays and her volunteer staff gave approximately 400 Moderna vaccinations at Grace Emmanuel Baptist church in Flint. April 30, 2021 Dr. Rogers-


Grays organized the second Moderna vaccination at the same site, which was also highly successful.




Greetings,

GCHD is Tracking COVID Vaccinations for the State to Facilitate Easing of Restrictions.

If an individual has been vaccinated in another state for COVID-19 it has to be documented in the state of Michigan to be included in our vaccination rate. This will help in accelerating the process of easing restrictions and reaching community immunity faster, as well as making sure the individual's medical records are complete. Here is how to make sure your patients are accounted for in Michigan.

For the snowbirds, out of state college students, or people who traveled to nearby states to obtain their vaccine, we want to be sure your patients are counted for the MICHIGAN COVID-19 vaccine rate. As the primary care physician, you will want to make sure their records accurately reflect their Covid-19 vaccine status.

Please assess the vaccine status at each visit. If they provide the out of state vaccine card document the vaccine date, dose, manufacturer, lot number, volume, administrative route and site in the MCIR system. Note many EHR systems interface into the MCIR system. If the patient cannot find their card, instruct the patient to obtain a copy from the state health department or facility where the vaccine was administered. If the first dose was administered out of state and they need a second dose they can access the Genesee County Health Department website <https://www.gchd.us/> for securing their second dose. They will need to bring their vaccine card with them to obtain the second dose if the first dose was completed out of state.

If we all work together we can reach community immunity faster. This will ease restrictions and move closer to life before COVID-19. Thank you for your help.



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

## Zion National Park in All It's Splendor

There is a dangerous bill making its way through the state legislature that would immediately negatively impact the health and wellbeing of patients across Michigan while also setting a dangerous precedent for the future of patient care.

House Bill 4359 removes the common-sense requirement that a physician supervise anesthesia procedures in Michigan. Plainly put, it is legislation that allows hospitals to replace doctors with nurses. It is nothing more than a cost-cutting measure that threatens the health and safety of Michigan's patients.

We are already seeing the negative consequences of this kind of legislation play out in neighboring states.

A hospital in Wisconsin recently replaced all its anesthesiologists with certified registered nurse anesthetists (CRNAs), undermining the value and expertise of physicians and jeopardizing patients in the process. It's a move that demonstrates that too many hospitals are driven by their financial bottom line, and it begs the question of what cuts come next? Where does it end once hospitals decide they can replace physicians with nurses?

The Michigan State Medical Society has battled back against certified registered nurse anesthetists (CRNAs) scope of practice expansion numerous times over the years, but the threat has never been more serious than it is now.

Buoyed by support from the Michigan Hospital Association (MHA), HB 4359 recently made its way through the state House and has since been passed on to the Senate for consideration. This process has made two truths abundantly clear:

1. Michigan's patients are more than numbers on a balance sheet. The bill sacrifices supervision of high-risk care in all settings to set the stage for staffing changes in hospitals that will strip patients' access to physicians. We're already seeing the endgame play out in states like Wisconsin, where one hospital recently announced its plan to replace all physician anesthesiologists with CRNAs.
2. The need for the physician community as whole to unite and advocate for what's in the best interest of our patients has never been greater.

MSMS has always worked to fill this role, uniting the voices of physicians throughout the state who are committed to delivering the best in quality care to patients across Michigan. However, in moments like this, the need for that unifying voice is greatest at our state capital. That's where MDPAC comes in.

When state lawmakers consider policy and legislation with the potential to dramatically alter the medical landscape—like HB 4359—MDPAC has been there to provide physicians with a seat at the table.

In years past, MDPAC—through effective lobbying and effort on the political front—has always worked with lawmakers to assure the safety of patients before, during, and after anesthesia.

We've reminded legislators that supervision of anesthesia care requires years of education and training and the experience and expertise that only physicians possess. MDPAC's success depends on your ongoing support.



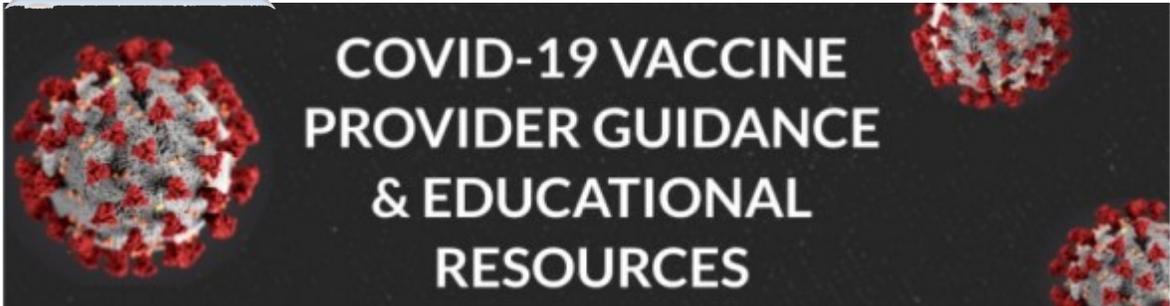

**Submitting a volunteer application alone will not confirm you as a volunteer.**

**Step 1** – [CLICK HERE to complete volunteer application](#) (*You must be at least 18 years old to volunteer*)

**Step 2** – Your application will be processed (*We are experiencing a high number of applications at this time. Applications may take 2-3 weeks to process.*)

**Step 3** – Once your application has been processed, you will receive an email confirming your volunteer status. This email will provide instructions on how to select a volunteer date and time.

**Vaccines for volunteers may be available if there are appointment cancellations, but cancellations are rare and there is no guarantee of this availability.** *To be eligible for vaccine, volunteers must live or work in Genesee County.*


