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ROSA Total Knee Replacement Now Offered in Genesee County

One of the greatest gifts in life is the ability to walk with no pain and no assistance. This gift is often taken for granted until it is painful to walk or lost all together. The ability to walk independently creates endless opportunities for an individual such as working, hiking, shopping, vacation, a long scenic walk. When I think of the beautiful places I have walked there are many that come to my mind. Disney Land is one of my favorite places to explore and enjoy the beautiful scenery and landscaping. The streets of Toronto are amazing to traverse, you never know what you will see or buy.

The gift is taken away from thousands of people in this country every year. Many individuals experience constant knee pain and can no longer walk with any distance. When daily activity is affected, a surgical replacement of the knee may be indicated.

Indications for knee replacement include Osteoarthritis, other types of arthritis, knee trauma, and sports injury. Non-surgical treatments are available that may prolong a surgical procedure. A knee replacement may be a partial replacement or total. This is dependent on the condition of the knee and determined by the orthopedic surgeon.

Traditional total knee replacement surgery involves an orthopedic surgeon extracting the knee and replacing with a prosthetic device. The surgeon measures the size of the prosthesis required and replaces the knee with the appropriate prosthesis. The sizing and implant are dependent on the orthopedic surgeon.

The ROSA (Robotic Surgical Assistant) system assists the orthopedic surgeon with bone resections and assesses soft tissues to help improve the overall success rate of a total knee replacement. ROSA robotic knee replacement is ideal for patients with early to mid-stage osteoarthritis. Osteoarthritis is a degenerative joint disease that causes cartilage breakdown in the knee. Common symptoms include knee pain, stiffness, and swelling with no improvement with conservative treatments.

In the preoperative phase the surgeon obtains multiple x-rays to create a 3-Dimensional image of the knee. This allows the surgeon to plan the surgical procedure exactly to the patient prior to the actual surgery. The surgeon guides the robotic hands of ROSA based on the plan developed preoperatively. It is a tool used by the surgeon to ensure the implants' accuracy.

A robotic- assisted total knee replacement is not only precise; it is personalized for each patient. ROSA uses data collected before and during the surgery for precision of the procedure. The orthopedic surgeon utilizes the information from ROSA to detail the patient’s unique anatomy to achieve care with accuracy. ROSA gives real-time information combining data, imaging, and range of motion assessments during the procedure. The orthopedic surgeon uses real-time data to enhance their skills throughout the procedure to ensure accuracy. Not all patients requiring a total knee replacement are candidates for the ROSA assisted procedure.

The ROSA assisted total knee replacement offers a minimally invasive approach with additional potential benefits:

- A small incision with reduced scarring and minimal bleeding

- Precise implant placement
- Decreased risk of pain and complications
- Reduced injury to nearby tissues
- A fast return to activities of daily living
- Increases the longevity of the implant

The ROSA robotic total knee replacement procedure is currently available at 16 different hospitals in the state.

I am very pleased ROSA is available in Genesee County.





Volunteer Sign Up – COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic

The Genesee County Health Department is looking for volunteers to assist in the delivery of COVID-19 vaccine throughout Genesee County. Please follow the steps below if you are at least 18 years old and interested in volunteering at an upcoming GCHD COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic.

Submitting a volunteer application alone will not confirm you as a volunteer.

Volunteer opportunities are available at our [Burton Branch](#) and at various TBD community locations.

Step 1 – [CLICK HERE to complete volunteer application](#) (You must be at least 18 years old to volunteer)

Step 2 – Your application will be processed (We are experiencing a high number of applications at this time. Applications may take 2-3 weeks to process.)

Step 3 – Once your application has been processed, you will receive an email confirming your volunteer status. This email will provide instructions on how to select a volunteer date and time.

Vaccines for volunteers may be available if there are appointment cancellations, but cancellations are rare and there is no guarantee of this availability. *To be eligible for vaccine, volunteers must live or work in Genesee County.*



Virgilio Bonet M.D.

June 29, 1931 ~ May 29, 2021 (age 89)

BONET, Virgilio M.D. - Age 89, of Flint Township, passed away May 29, 2021. Per his wishes, cremation has taken place and a celebration of his life will be held at a later date. Those desiring may make contributions to Masses or the Alzheimer's Association.

Dr. Bonet was born June 29, 1931 in El Carmen, Norte de Santander, Colombia. Upon arriving to the US from Colombia, he received his undergraduate degree from Emmanuel Missionary College in Berrien Springs, MI in 1953.

He continued on to Medical School at the Universidad de Nuevo Leon in Monterrey, Mexico. Virgil returned to Michigan to complete his surgical residency at Hurley Hospital/University of Michigan in Flint.

He started private practice in Flint in 1965 providing surgical services at Hurley, McLaren and St Joseph Hospitals, eventually becoming the Chief of Surgery at McLaren Hospital.

Virgil was a member of the Michigan State Medical Society and was a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons. His proudest achievements surrounded his work in surgical education after becoming a Professor in the Department of Surgery at Michigan State University in 1981, eventually managing the overall surgical residency program for McLaren Hospital until his retirement in 2001 when he was awarded the title of Professor Emeritus.

Virgil was an avid reader, loved golf, watching sports, playing cards with his buddies, swimming, his dog Roxy and enjoying the winter sunshine in Boynton Beach Florida with his wife Mary Katherine.

He is survived by his wife, Mary Katherine; children, Brent Bonet, Lisa Bonet, Brian (Sandra) Bonet, Ramona (Jim) Kitching; grandchildren, Marcus, Maya, Javi, Marcela and Aja; siblings, Rafael, Celina, Esperanza and Maria Eugenia.

GHS Intensive Crisis Stabilization Services for Children and Young Adults



The GHS Children's Intensive Crisis Stabilization Team (ICSS) provides mobile crisis stabilization services, 7 days a week between 8:00am and 7:00pm to all children, youth, and young adults (ages 0-21) who reside in Genesee County. Calls during other hours are helped by our Crisis Line mental health professionals.

Reasons to call GHS:

- If you feel your child/youth is in a crisis
- The child/youth may hurt themselves or others
- The child is experiencing overwhelming confusion, anger, or emotional unresponsiveness

If you aren't sure if ICSS is needed, give us a call and we can help to explore options.

What happens when the GHS Intensive Crisis Team is called?

The team will provide an on-site intervention with the identified child or youth, and their support system. The team's main focus will be to help assess the crisis, utilize de-escalation techniques, help the child/youth and their family or support system to help with what is needed and to help determine next steps and long-term care.

Other services include:

- Crisis and Safety Planning
- Referrals to needed services
- Education on resources, diagnosis and services
- Collaboration and problem solving

* Psychiatric consults, as needed (does not include medication review for prescription)

** Intensive Crisis Stabilization services cannot be provided to individuals who are currently residing in inpatient settings: Jail/detention centers or residential settings (i.e. child caring institutions, crisis residential, etc.).
