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MAKO Orthopedic Robotic Assist Knee Replacement

In January 2023 an article was published in the Bulletin on the MAKO orthopedic robotic assisted knee replacement system. This is a follow up article collaborating with Dr. Seann Willson to determine the patient benefits from the MAKO System in her orthopedic practice, with eight years of MAKO experience. The original article is included at the end of this article.

Dr Seann Willson, has incorporated the MAKO Robotic System into her practice since 2015. One of the most significant advantages of the MAKO system is the ability to provide greater precision and customization of the surgical procedure for each patient. This technology will customize each patient's specific anatomy with the implant. The MAKO Orthopedic Robotic System is a revolutionary knee replacement surgery combining the expertise of the surgeon with the precision of robotic technology. The greater precision and customization for each specific patient with the MAKO System allows for a precise implant placement.

The Benefits

Precise implant placement which increases native bone preservation.

In the post-operative period, the patients experience faster recovery times with less pain.

A reduction in post operative pain medications is a common benefit to the procedure.

Faster post-operative recovery times are also commonly observed by Dr. Willson.

Patients may return to daily activity or work in a shorter period of time.

This procedure may not be indicated in all patients. A preoperative screening must be performed by a qualified orthopedic surgeon.

The Mako Orthopedic Robot is Available in Genesee County

One of the newest developments in technology for orthopedic surgery has been the evolution of Robotic Assisted surgery for joint replacement procedures. The Stryker MAKO Robotic System obtained FDA approval in August of 2015, as a robotic assisted orthopedic surgical assist.

The MAKO SmartRobotics System combines three key components:

- 1. A 3D CT based preoperative plan
- 2. AccuStop haptic technology
- 3. Data analytics

This is put into 1 platform for greater surgical precision and improved patient outcomes.

The MAKO System utilizes a 3-Dimensional(3D) CT study as a preoperative guide. This offers a plan unique to each patient that the surgeon can review before the surgical procedure. Additionally, MAKO allows for accurate and optimal implant positioning unique for each patient. This can mean preserving soft tissues for some patients; for others, saving healthy bone.

The surgeon is in control of the robotic system, maneuvering it with their hands and utilizing the feedback from the AccuStop haptics for a more accurate placement of the hip or knee implant. By guiding the physician during surgery with the robotic assist arm, Mako's AccuStop[™] technology allows the surgeon to cut precisely and cut less, preserving bone.

The advantage of the MAKO System is greater precision and customization for Knee & Hip replacement surgery. The goal of the Mako System is to provide additional flexibility and better fit by providing more precision and consistency during placement. This may lead to less wear and tear over the life of the artificial joint.

There are only approximately 1400 MAKO Robotic Assist Systems used worldwide. I am very pleased this technology is available in Genesee County.







GHS Intensive Crisis Stabilization Services for Children and Young Adults





The GHS Children's Intensive Crisis Stabilization Team (ICSS) provides mobile crisis stabilization services, 7 days a week between 8:00am and 7:00pm to all children, youth, and young adults (ages 0-21) who reside in Genesee County. Calls during other hours are helped by our Crisis Line mental health professionals.

Reasons to call GHS:

- If you feel your child/youth is in a crisis
- The child/youth may hurt themselves or others
- The child is experiencing overwhelming confusion, anger, or emotional unresponsiveness

If you aren't sure if ICSS is needed, give us a call and we can help to explore options.

What happens when the GHS Intensive Crisis Team is called?

The team will provide an on-site intervention with the identified child or youth, and their support system. The team's main focus will be to help assess the crisis, utilize de-escalation techniques, help the child/youth and their family or support system to help with what is needed and to help determine next steps and long-term care.

Other services include:

- Crisis and Safety Planning
- Referrals to needed services
- · Education on resources, diagnosis and services
- · Collaboration and problem solving

* Psychiatric consults, as needed (does not include medication review for prescription)

** Intensive Crisis Stabilization services cannot be provided to individuals who are currently residing in inpatient settings: Jail/detention centers or residential settings (i.e. child caring institutions, crisis residential, etc.).
